1.1 SECTION 1: INSTRUCTIONS TO PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS

<u>Preparation of Proposals</u>: You are requested to submit separate technical and financial proposal, as detailed below. The standard forms in this Request for Proposal may be retyped for completion but the bidder is responsible for their accurate reproduction. You are advised to carefully read the complete Request for Proposals.

<u>Technical Proposals</u>: Technical proposals should contain the following documents and information:

- 1. The Technical Proposal Submission Sheet in this Part;
- 2. An approach and methodology for supplying and installing of the required products/devices;
- 3. Company profile and experience
- 4. A summary of your experience in similar assignments with work completion proof;

1.2 SECTION 2: ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

<u>Eligibility Criteria</u>: You are required to meet the following criteria to be eligible to participate in the procurement exercise:

- 1. have the legal capacity to enter into a contract;
- 2. not be insolvent, in receivership, bankrupt or being wound up or subject to legal proceedings for any of these circumstances;
- 3. not have had your business activities suspended;
- 4. have fulfilled your obligations to pay taxes and social security contributions;
- 5. have the nationality of an eligible (defined in the proceeding section) country;
- 6. not to have a conflict of interest in relation to this procurement requirement; and
- 7. Not have a conflict of interest in relation to this procurement project.

<u>Documents Evidencing Eligibility</u>: Bidders are requested to submit copies of the following documents as evidence of your eligibility and sign the declaration in the Technical Proposal Submission Sheet:

- 1. Certificate of Incorporation
- 2. A copy of the Bidder's Trading licence or equivalent and a copy of the Bidder's Certificate of Registration;
- 3. Evidence of statutory compliance such as a valid tax clearance certificate from RRA
- 4. Social Security (NSSF) certificate of compliance
- 5. Power of attorney with a specimen signature of authorised representative
- 5. Any other relevant documentation.

<u>Nationality of Personnel</u>: All personnel employed under any resulting contract shall have the nationality of an eligible country to conduct business in Rwanda.

All countries are eligible, unless as a matter of law or official regulation, the Government of Rwanda prohibits commercial relations with that country or by an act of compliance with a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, the Government of Rwanda prohibits any import of Supplies from that country or any payments to persons or entities in that country.

1.3 SECTION 3: EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS

<u>Evaluation of Proposals:</u> The evaluation of Proposals will use the **Quality Cost Based** methodology as detailed below:

- 1. Preliminary examination to determine eligibility (as defined below) and administrative compliance to this Request for Proposals on a pass/fail basis;
- 2. Detailed Technical evaluation will contribute 80%;
- 3. Financial scores will be allocated 20% to determine the best evaluated bid.

Proposals failing at any stage will be eliminated and not considered in subsequent stages.

Financial Criteria:

Pricing information should not appear in any other section of the proposal other than the financial proposal.

Financial scores shall be determined by awarding 20 points to the lowest priced proposal and giving all other proposals a score, which is proportionate to this.

<u>Total scores</u>: Total scores shall be determined using a weighting of 80% for technical proposals and a weighting of 20% for financial proposals.

<u>Currency</u>: Proposals should be priced in **American Dollars (USD) with an exchange rate to the local currency.**

<u>Best Evaluated Bid</u>: The best-evaluated bid shall be the firm with the highest combined score and shall be recommended for award of contract.

Right to Reject:

AFR reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to reject all proposals received and seek fresh proposals, to negotiate further with one or more of the bidders, to defer the award of a contract or to cancel the competition and make no contract award, if appropriate.

CODE OF ETHICAL CONDUCT IN BUSINESS FOR BIDDERS AND PROVIDERS

1. Ethical Principles

Bidders and providers shall at all times-

- (a) maintain integrity and independence in their professional judgement and conduct;
- (b) comply with both the letter and the spirit of
 - i. the laws of Rwanda; and ii.

(c) Avoid associations with businesses and organizations, which are in conflict with this code

2. Standards

Bidders and providers shall-

- (a) strive to provide works, services and supplies of high quality and accept full responsibility for all works, services or supplies provided;
- (b) Comply with the professional standards of their industry or of any professional body of which they are members.

3. Conflict of Interest

Bidders and providers shall not accept contracts which would constitute a conflict of interest with, any prior or current contract with AFR. Bidders and providers shall disclose to all concerned parties those conflicts of interest that cannot reasonably be avoided or escaped.

4. Confidentiality and Accuracy of Information

- (1)Information given by bidders and providers in the course of procurement processes or the performance of contracts shall be true, fair and not designed to mislead.
- (2) Providers shall respect the confidentiality of information received in the course of performance of a contract and shall not use such information for personal gain.

5. Gifts and Hospitality

2.0 TERMS OF REFERENCE

Background

AFR is a Rwandan not for Profit organization, established in March 2010 by the governments of the United Kingdom (UK) and Rwanda and with support from the UK Department for International Development (DFID), and the World Bank. Existing funders of AFR include DFID, The MasterCard Foundation, Sweden and USAID.

The core objective of AFR is to stimulate the financial sector to remove systemic barriers, which hinder access to financial services by putting the poor at the center of its interventions in Rwanda. Improving access to financial services for the rural poor and women is a particular focus.

The Government of Rwanda recognizes the need to increase access to and usage of financial services in Rwanda as a key poverty reduction strategy. It is in this regard that it has supported different initiatives to promote financial inclusion including building the capacity of Savings and Credit Cooperatives (SACCOs).

It is important to note that despite their invaluable contribution to financial inclusion, some of the SACCOs still operate manually, which make them less efficient and competitive in delivering good service to their members and are prone to errors and fraud.

AFR has secured funding to automate the operational systems of tea growers owned SACCOs. and Non-tea Sacco's .This support should result into increased level of efficiency to propel the desired institutional growth.

AFR in collaboration with the SACCOs would therefore like to procure and install in AOS Data center (Kigali) below IT infrastructures to host the core Banking system used by Tea SACCOs and COOPEC supported by AFR.

3. Required competences and Qualification

The participating firm should have the following key competences and qualifications:

- The bidder should have five years' experience and three certificates of good completion of a similar task provide with a detailed work completed proof;
- The bidder should have partnership with Dell, Microsoft and Cisco
- Should have human resource certified in the following domains: Microsoft operating system, SQL server, storage, CCNA & Cisco Certified Network Professional Security. copies of their certificates should put in the technical proposal

4. Deliverables

The following will be undertaken and delivered:

- 1. Supply above listed materials
- 2. Configure necessary routing, VLAN, Firewall and other security configurations including AnyConnect remote access tool license for 100 users
- 3. Install & configure OS including mount point and partition in alignment with core banking supplier and deploy all required licenses
- 4. Install and configure SQL Server and windows server
- 5. Provide after sales service (maintenance) of one year. The maintenance will cover:
 - a. Check hardware status upon a customer call to fix a reported issue
 - b. Scheduled monthly Preventive maintenance of checking whether there is any hardware alarm and take a corrective action (one preventive maintenance site visit per month)
 - c. Install packages released by hardware manufacturer or software developer (Microsoft)
 - d. Replace any faulty device shared by hardware manufacturer or install a software package from Microsoft
- 6. Work with data center & connect internet uplink, electrical power, backup and make sure that everything is fine
- 7. Training resource designated by AFR or supported tea SACCOs before the handover
- 8. Collaborate with core banking system provider to ensure that required configurations to access the core banking system are in place
- 9. Provide an open source SNMP tool that will monitor the system resources utilization like CPU, memory, disk partition utilization and other system interface status and send

- sms alerts over SMPP to specific phone number when usage cross a pre-defined threshold. The tool should also be able to give system resources performance reports
- 10. Provide a logical and physical network diagram at the end of the installation and configurations at the end of the work
- 11. Provide a detailed description of what you understand as your duty as part of this project? Are there specific or itemized services that you do not provide? Detail services you will provide in addition to design plans and specifications
- 12. The supplier is responsible for providing the licenses required for the function of the delivered items
- 13. Comply with datacenter guide lines
- 14. Vendor who provides faster delivery will be given higher points/weight
- 15. 3 years devices warranty given by the hardware manufacturer (To replace/repair any faulty device and new software upgrade package release)
- 16. 1 year maintenance
- 17. All active hardwares (Servers, firewall, router switches) should have manufacturer end support period not less than 3 years
- 18. Mention delivery time & SLA Support response time
